HOME DAY CARE STANDARDS

BEFORE YOU START

The State of Missouri and the City of Grandview each have separate regulations that apply to home day care businesses. For information about the State of Missouri requirements please call the Missouri Dept. of Health offices at 816-325-5973 or 816-350-5450. For information about obtaining a city home occupation permit for day care please call the Development Services Division of the Grandview Community Development Department at 316-4822 or 316-4820.

DO I NEED BOTH CITY AND STATE LICENSES?

If you care for 5 to 10 unrelated children you **MUST** be licensed with the State of Missouri and receive a home occupation permit from the City of Grandview.

If you care for less than five unrelated children you are only required to receive an annual home occupation permit from the City of Grandview.

You must have a home occupation permit with the City of Grandview regardless of the number of unrelated children you have under your care. Ten (10) unrelated children is the maximum allowed in a home in a residential zoning district.

FIRE SAFETY INSPECTION

A key reason why the City requires a home occupation permit for home day care is to insure the safety of the children through compliance with the Fire Code. All home-based day care businesses in Grandview **MUST** receive Fire Department approval before a permit will be issued.

IS THERE AN APPLICATION FEE?

No. There is no application fee for the home occupation permit to operate a home-based day care.

WHERE DO I GET AN APPLICATION?

WHAT IS THE PENALTY IF I FAIL TO OBTAIN A HOME OCCUPATION PERMIT?

Persons who operate a home day care without a home occupation permit may be summoned to appear in Grandview Municipal Court and may be fined for the violation by the court. Each day the violation continues may be considered a separate violation.
