2014 BOND PROJECTS PROGRESS

"5-4-3-2-1!" The crowd counted down in unison as Mayor Leonard Jones readied the traditional giant scissors to cut the ribbon on Grandview's new splash park at The View.

Before the scissors could close hundreds of kids took off running, squealing with laughter and screaming with excitement as they headed for the slides, water cannons, sprayers, and water features.

Nearly 600 people showed up to splash and spray for the limited two-hour event on September 18.

"Everyone was so excited about the splash park finally being done that we couldn't just let it sit there until next spring," explains Parks & Recreation Director Sue Yerkes. "The weather was cooperating, so we decided to get the water flowing at least once before winterizing."

The new splash park at The View will still have a grand opening when it opens for the season in May of 2020.

When Parks & Recreation cut the ribbon on the new \$1.9 million splash park, it placed a check mark next to one more voter-approved bond project.

In August of 2014, Grandview voters approved two separate No-Tax-Increase Bond Issues-- one for public safety and one for parks & recreation.

PARKS: ONE MORE PROJECT

The parks bond package included four projects, three of which are now complete (see list at right). The last project, but definitely not least, is an expansion of The View.

Parks & Recreation worked hard to gather input from citizens as they started to plan the expansion project in 2018.

The department held two public meetings in the winter and also made a survey available to members of The View and online. The results were overwhelming: people wanted a larger fitness area.


The View expansion design team met in mid-September to go over the \$1.45 million project. Designers are expected to submit a rendering before the end of the year. Once submitted, it will be shared with the public at www.grandview.org.

Construction on the expansion could begin as early as spring of 2020.

PUBLIC SAFETY: COMPLETE

Grandview's Fire Department and Police Department have finally checked off all voter-approved projects included in the public safety bond package.

Firefighters quickly saw improvements to the fire stations where they live for 24-hour shifts at least twice a week.

"One great thing about the fire station remodel is the firefighters now have separate bunks, or bedrooms, which means we were able to house female firefighters at Fire Station Number One," explains Fire Chief Ron Graham.

Grandview Fire Department now has two women in the department, both hired as a result of the additions thanks to the public safety sales tax.

Firefighters also received a new ladder truck and refurbished pumper truck as part of the package. By doing so, this equipment was crucial to improving the department's Insurance Services Office rating from a four to a two.

Once approved by voters, Grandview Police Department made quick work of its biggest need: upgrading the City's Communications System. Thanks to the improvements, Grandview PD dispatchers and officers are now using the same system as other municipalities in Jackson County, simplifying the process during calls for mutual aid from other agencies.

Officers are also using its new storage building to better process evidence, particularly from vehicles. The new building also helped to increase the safety of the City Hall parking lot and traffic flow for the attached Police Department.

With the mid-September opening of the shooting range to

police training, all of the public safety bond projects are now complete.

The shooting range won't open to the public until required amenities, like bathrooms, are built. That work is expected to start later this fall.

The shooting range is expected to open to the public in the spring of 2020, so stay tuned to www.grandview.org for updates.


